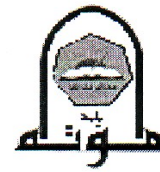

This study aimed to clarify the statement of the pattern of relations between Iraqi Kurds and Israel based on economic interests, military and political, through literature study and theoretical analysis of the relations between the parties and the impact of these relations on Iraq in particular and the Arab countries in general.

The study to answer the main question which is derived from a series of questions, "What is the nature of the relationship between the Kurdish region of northern Iraq, Israel and their impact on the security of the Iraqi state and Arab national security"?

After the war of Iraq did not stop the Israeli-Kurdish relations, but continued and continued cooperation between the parties although there are many people who called off the relationship but to no avail, and it was this cooperation is clear to all, and findings of this study to the following: the Israeli-Kurdish relations and after consideration and research it and document between the parties since a long time as established by the Barzani after the end of the British Mandate, Israel has deliberately to exploit this relationship and raise the collision between the Kurds and central government. Israel has been the consolidation of this relationship to the detriment of Iraq being the only Arab country that refused to sign the armistice agreement with Israel in 1948, and has had positions Aiza Arab issues in general and the Palestinian issue in particular. reached the limits of this relationship to the training of Kurdish army at the hands of trainers and military officials as well as various forms of support by Israel for the Kurds. The Kurds provide intelligence information and intelligence needed by the Israeli Intelligence Agency to weaken Iraq and fragmentation and the disruption of its capabilities, and this goal jointly with the American policy as well. The presence of undercover Israeli soldiers moved into Iraqi Kurdistan, in addition to the presence of evangelical campaigns, as a cultural artistic exchange between the parties. A reflection of a significant impact as a result of these relations between the Kurds and Israelis of the Iraqi state and security dramatically, and the other Arab countries. He was for Israel and its relationship with the Kurdish role in the war waged by America against Iraq in 2003. In order to achieve its goal of Greater Israel from the Nile to the Euphrates, also used by the Kurds to seek an independent state, the Soviets picked also instigates the creation of this war and share their side.
