2. Having enlisted a nucleus of 30 mounted men, Malleson, in April last, asked our permission to expand to 100, and to be prepared to expand, if necessary, to 300. Tehran supported the proposal and we approved.

On June 27th, Malleson wired that good material was forthcoming and requested permission to enlist to a total of 300 immediately. In view of the Trans Caspian situation, we have approved in anticipation of your sanction.

The estimated cost of whole 300 is 8,000 tomens monthly or less. Their duties are to maintain order in turbulent area, act as despatch riders on Kuchan-Bajgiran and Kuchan-Bujnurd roads, deal with the armed gangs of refugees which are constantly entering Persia, and generally to serve as military support in case of incursion by Bolsheviks. Malleson also states that they have a marked steadying effect on the Khan of Bajnurd.

Foreign Office consider that at present it is politically undesirable that any steps should be taken likely to create a suspicion that decisions of Peace Conference are being prejudged by His Majesty's Government. Formation of councils approved in my telegram of 9th May (Dy. No. 35913) was sanctioned solely as steps towards evolution and decentralisation of temporary military administration. Decision must not necessarily be assumed to imply permanent combination of provinces or permanent guardianship of His Majesty's Government, you should therefore refrain most scrupulously from any action giving rise to impression in Mosul Villayet or elsewhere that future political status of Mesopotamia has been already decided upon.



I venture at the risk of incurring His Majesty's Government's displeasure to recall the views submitted in my telegram 10973, of 10th December last (Dy. No. 99408).

I submit that if we are to prevent anarchy in the Middle East the political problems of Mesopotamia must be regarded not primarily from the Arab stand-

point but in relation to our policy in the Middle East and in consequence we must be prepared to interpret declaration of November 8th less literally here than in other Arab speaking countries. Persia, Kurdistan, Syria, Turkey, Arabia the historic homes of disorder, these are our neighbours and from no one point can they be so effectively influenced as from Baghdad.

The oriental Christian community of Kurdistan look to us as their last hope. The Kurds as a whole still stand aloof, but Kurdish leaders such as Simko and Sayyid Taha and those with whom Major Noel is in touch are looking for a sign and if we could give them a lead they would follow it.

It is impossible to install a real Arab Government in Mesopotamia an if we attempt it we shall abandon Middle East to anarchy.

If I may be permitted to say so declaration of November 8th took little account of facts as they are in Mesopotamia but it is not too late to give this pronouncement a fresh and virile interpretation which will enable us to make Mesopotamia the key-stone of our policy in the Middle East.

Much of political intrigue which appears in police reports is due to uncertainty of mind which this declaration and the approach of a "Commission" has engendered our own silence and inability to counter that intrigue by propaganda or repression has encouraged men's doubts.

There is still a strong body of inarticulate opinion which will remain soid with us if we steer a steady course and make known our intention to, stay and govern.

Capital value of Mesopotamian oil-fields is at a conservative estima 50,000,000 pounds sterling and there are other potential sources of wealth Railways, steamers, ports, roads, and buildings built by British capital whether public or private counting for a least another 10,000,000.

Trade has not yet revived but imports this year are estimated at about 10,000,000 mainly British.



(Repeated Foreign Secretary to the Government of India, Foreign and Political Department, Baghdad.)

A letter has been received by Deputy Governor of Dashti from Sheikh Hussain and Zair Khidar expressing complete submission and offering to come into him wherever appointed on the sole condition that they are not to be arrested on arrival. Deputy Governor has consented to comply with condition and has sent for them to meet him at Samal where he arrives on 30th. I have enquired what meaning exactly he attaches to their condition and have

told him that it should not be considered to obstruct execution of any orders which the Persian Government may give. It is desirable that question of terms should be settled with least possible delay so that Deputy Governor may proceed with his (gr. undec) district. I have discussed matter with Governor-General and General Officer Commanding. There is no desire to press for execution of these rebels. Sole important point from our point of view is that they should be rendered harmless vis-a-vis their successors our nominees. In addition to this it would seem that Persian Government ought to desire to punish them for long-standing disobedience and non-payment of revenue. The real point of difficulty concerns the disposal of their persons. If they are permitted to remain in their districts on any terms whatever there can be no doubt that disturbances will occur engendered by one party discredit (? discrediting) the other. This opinion is most emphatically hold by Governor of Gulf Ports. (? Governor-general) suggests that precedent of Soulet should be followed i.e., that they should be permitted to reside near but not in their districts e. g., at Kalimeh on condition that (? Sheikh) sends his son to Shiraz as a hostage and deposits in the Imperial Bank of Persia a considerable sum, as a guarantee against misbehaviour or departure from allotted residence without permission. He suggests no amount owing to ignorance of their circumstances. If this course is approved I would propose to consult Governor of Bushire and Deputy Governor as to a suitable amount. It would also seem suitable for Persian Government to impose considerable fine in addition. I would in any case add to above, surrender of at least 50 rifles and a proportionate amount of cartridges.

Drawback to above course is that it does not secure their (Gr. undec) but I do not think the latter is compatible with (? our) demand for either cash or rifles, and as Governor-General says, once their teeth are drawn they can always be dealt with later. On the whole therefore I recommend his suggestion being adopted in principle. Further details might be left to discretion of Deputy Governor and Political Officer, e.g., names of principal incorrigibles to be interned with them and actual village for internment.


